Park Projects

We are very fortunate to have more area scouts choosing to take on Gamblewood park improvements for their Eagle Scout Projects. Last year Jake Kvistad installed the climber/cave play structure now at our Waterfront

Park. This year two more scouts will be working to make our park more fun (and safe).

Scout Cole Coddington is preparing to build a horseshoe pit for our enjoyment at the Waterfront Park. Cole's plans have been approved by the Board and include planters around the pit ends and an adjacent table at which to sit. The project should be completed later this spring. A horseshoe pit was requested by residents attending last summer's Annual Meeting; those of you looking forward to playing will need to bring your own horseshoes.

Gamblewood resident and scout Dante Miguel will be replacing the split log "bridge"

that spans the ravine on the west side of the Waterfront Park with an improved and much safer foot bridge. The land to the west of the ravine is an under-utilized part of our park that is too often just a place for youth to gather "out of view". We've tried to open a visual corridor into the area and hopefully Dante's new bridge will make the area more inviting to all. Bridge work should be completed this spring as well.

Ball field improvements are also planned. New bases, home plate and a pitcher's rubber will be installed this spring to replace the weather/time beaten ones that are currently in place.

GCC Board Update

In January the Gamblewood Board lost its Vice President when member Gus Holstein resigned. Gus is also the President of a much larger service organization in Kitsap County and found his time too constrained to do both jobs justice. Gus had been a valued member of our Board for a year and a half—his contributions to GCC were appreciated and will be missed.

Our Secretary, Tori Dougherty, is expecting her second child early this summer, and with husband scheduled to deploy has let us know that she will not be able to complete her term all the way through to June but will stick it out as long as she can manage.

Vandalism Blues

This winter we've seen more vandalism being perpetrated on our community property. A new sign in the Waterfront Park was spray painted, a play structure was spray painted and hacked on, a 4 wheeler did "doughnuts" on the lawn, a truckload of scrap wood was dumped at the park entrance blocking our new pedestrian entrance. All of these sorts of

things are destructive and troubling and ultimately expensive to our association. We'd all like to see our dues going to improving and maintaining our community rather than repairing and replacing property damaged in thoughtlessness or malice.

The best way we can protect our community parks is to use them—your presence alone is a deterrent. If you see somebody treating your community property poorly stand up and say something, let them know we won't tolerate it, contact the Board or call the police if appropriate.

Spring Cleanup

Our annual Earth Day Gamblewood Cleanup effort will be held on Saturday, April 23 this year. Help cleanup the trash that accumulates alongside our roads and parks over the winter by meeting at the Border Way play park at 10:00 a.m. Trash bags will be provided, it is a good idea to bring some gloves and to wear boots.

Park Shelters

The covered shelters at the Waterfront Park are showing the effects of time and the elements. The older of the two structures in particular is looking like it may need some work done before it starts to lean too much and become a bigger problem, and some of the picnic tables underneath the shelters are in need of new supports or replacement.



The Board is having these issues looked at by some contractors to get estimates as to the scope and cost of the work that will become inevitable eventually. The Board has a discretionary budget that allows us to take care of smaller projects and more routine needs, but depending on the amount that these repairs will cost we may have to bring this shelter work to a community vote. This notice is not meant to alarm you or posture for a dues increase or anything like that, it is just to let you know about an issue that is on the horizon that may require your thought and input in the coming months.
