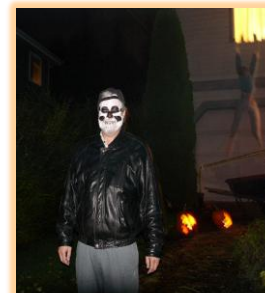

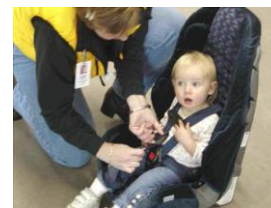

2010 CENSUS INFORMATION

WHAT TO EXPECT

The 2010 Census aims to count all U.S. residents—citizens and non-citizens alike. To do so, the Census Bureau:

- Delivers a short 10-question form to every household in America
- Requires that you fill in the form to account for everyone living at your address as of April 1, 2010
- Includes a prepaid envelope with the form so you can mail it back as soon as possible

WHAT & WHO IS A CENSUS TAKER

A [census taker](#) must follow-up in person with every address that doesn't mail back the form in order to obtain the responses. By being counted you are standing up for what your community's needs are. That's why census takers are so important. A census taker is a person from your community who is hired by the Census Bureau to make sure that your neighborhood gets represented as accurately as possible. The census takers primary responsibility is to collect census information from residences that have not sent back their 2010 Census form.

If a census taker visits you, here's what you should do:

- First ask to see their ID. All census workers carry official government badges marked with just their name; they may also have a "U.S. Census Bureau" bag
- Note that the census taker will never ask to enter your home
- If you're still not certain about their identity, please call the Regional Census Center's to confirm they are employed by the Census Bureau.
- The Census Bureau provides the census taker with a binder containing all of the addresses that didn't send back a filled out census form
- The census taker then visits all of those addresses and records the answers to the questions on the form
- If no one answers at a particular residence, a census taker will visit that home up to three times, each time leaving a door hanger featuring a phone number; residents can call the number on the hanger to schedule the visit.

The census taker will **ONLY** ask the questions that appear on the census form.

Do I have to talk to the census taker?

Yes. Your participation in the 2010 Census is vital and required by law, (Section 221, of Title 13 of the U.S. Code). Your privacy and confidentiality is our priority:

The census taker who collects your information is sworn for life to protect your data under Federal Law Title 13. Those who violate the oath face criminal penalties: Under federal law, the penalty for unlawful disclosure is a fine of up to \$250,000 or imprisonment for up to 5 years, or both.

OLYMPIA – Gov. Chris Gregoire today joined Seattle Regional Census Director Ralph Lee, Secretary of State Sam Reed and other elected leaders to help launch the 2010 U.S. Census. Information gathered by the census helps determine how more than \$400 billion of federal funding each year is spent on projects and services.

Questions You will be Asked:

This year's census form contains just **10 questions**, the least amount of questions since the 1790 census. Questions ask for **name, gender, address, age, birth date, race, ethnicity and if the home the person is living in is owned or rented**. All answers are kept confidential.

SERVICES OFFERED

Some Gamblewood residents that have businesses, or who offer services out of their homes, have asked if they could advertise in the Gazette and/or on our website. The board has decided that we would offer FREE advertising to Gamblewood residents who are in good standing. Here are the guidelines:

- ✓ The business has to be a legal business and run out of your home in Gamblewood. You can offer a service that is not done in your home, i.e., lawn service, but the business needs to be run from your home address.
- ✓ The ad should be business card sized and include your name and contact information. You may email or send a digital version of your ad (business card) to: dgreen@gccinfo.org.
- ✓ You may petition the Board if your business office is out of Gamblewood, but you live here.
- ✓ Ads in the Gazette will be on a space available basis. The Board reserves the right to pull or reject questionable ads.

FIREWORKS DISCHARGE GUIDELINES

With the Holidays and New Year's Eve coming up we want to remind you of Firework guidelines for Kitsap County. This article from the 4th of July also applies any time of the year. Have a safe and Happy Holiday!

Celebrate safely with the "Three B's"

"Independence Day" is a time to celebrate our freedom. With this freedom comes a shared responsibility to ensure the safe use of *legal* fireworks. Every year fireworks injure people and cause vegetation and structure fires.

Before lighting fireworks -- Be Prepared!

Purchase only legal fireworks, available at licensed stands. Purchase only the quantity that you will use. Ensure the safety of pets. Keep a bucket of water nearby in which to place all used fireworks. Have a water hose or fire extinguisher nearby to put out stray sparks. Clear a level area away from things that can burn. Have a basic first aid kit nearby and a cordless or mobile / cellular telephone in case emergency assistance is required. Children should know how to "stop, drop and roll" if their clothing catches on fire.

When lighting fireworks -- Be Safe!

Only adults should light fireworks. Use eye protection, wear safety goggles. Light one at a time and move away quickly.

Keep spectators at a safe distance. Use fireworks only outside. To prevent injuries, follow the directions on the label carefully.

Be considerate of your neighbors, family pets and your environment.

When finished -- Be Responsible!

Clean up all debris when finished. Duds can be dangerous; if a firework item does not light or fire, an adult should wait five minutes, approach it carefully and place it in a bucket of water. Make sure that used fireworks, matches and lighters are out of sight and reach of children.

Jake Kvistad took on the task of researching equipment, presenting it to the Board for approval, purchasing and installing the “Climber Tunnel” as his Eagle Scout Project. The site was professionally excavated and installation was done by Jake with the help of his Eagle Scout Troop.

Many thanks to Jake, his Eagle Scout Troop # 1571 and Board member Tom Moench who worked closely with Jake to provide support and help to make this project happen.

The selection is a large rocklike crawl thru with climbing holds on the outside that is made of very durable material called the “Climber Tunnel”. The toy installation is complete and is located between the swings and the picnic benches. Parents can sit and enjoy watching their children having fun!
