Fire Destroys Home on Carlin Court in Late November

Our concerns go out to the homeowners who suffered fire damage to their home.

Excerpt from the Kitsap Sun, "A fire destroyed a large, mobile single-wide home located off Firwood Road in Gamblewood. North Kitsap Fire and Rescue crews were dispatched to the fire at 7:12 p.m. after several neighbors called 911. When crews arrived the home was fully engulfed in flames. They were able to put the flames out in about 10 minutes, but there was little they could do to save the home, according to NK Fire spokeswoman Michele Laboda. According to neighbors, three people live in the home. Crews were still trying to locate and notify them of the fire at 8:30 Tuesday night. Between 18 and 20 firefighters remained on the scene Tuesday night putting out hotspots and waiting for the Kitsap County Fire Marshal to arrive to determine what might have caused the fire".

2010 CENSUS INFORMATION RECAP

WHAT TO EXPECT

The 2010 Census aims to count all U.S. residents—citizens and non-citizens alike. To do so, the Census Bureau:

- Delivers a short 10-question form to every household in America
- Requires that you fill in the form to account for everyone living at your address as of April 1, 2010
- Includes a prepaid envelope with the form so you can mail it back as soon as possible

WHAT & WHO IS A CENSUS TAKER

A <u>census taker</u> must follow-up in person with every address that doesn't mail back the form in order to obtain the responses. By being counted you are standing up for what your community's needs are. That's why census takers are so important. A census taker is a person from your community who is hired by the Census Bureau to make sure that your neighborhood gets represented as accurately as possible. The census takers primary responsibility is to collect census information from residences that have not sent back their 2010 Census form.

If a census taker visits you, here's what you should do:

- First ask to see their ID. All census workers carry official government badges marked with just their name; they may also have a "U.S. Census Bureau" bag
- Note that the census taker will never ask to enter your home
- If you're still not certain about their identity, please call the Regional Census Center's to confirm they are employed by the Census Bureau.
- The Census Bureau provides the census taker with a binder containing all of the addresses that didn't send back a filled out census form
- The census taker then visits all of those addresses and records the answers to the questions on the form
- If no one **answers** at a particular residence, a census taker will visit that home up to three times, each time leaving a door hanger featuring a phone number; residents can call the number on the hanger to schedule the visit.

The census taker will ONLY ask the questions that appear on the census form.

Do I have to talk to the census taker?

Yes. Your participation in the 2010 Census is vital and required by law, (Section 221, of Title 13 of the U.S. Code). Your privacy and confidentiality is our priority:

The census taker who collects your information is sworn for life to protect your data under Federal Law Title 13. Those who violate the oath face criminal penalties: Under federal law, the penalty for unlawful disclosure is a fine of up to \$250,000 or imprisonment for up to 5 years, or both.

OLYMPIA – Gov. Chris Gregoire today joined Seattle Regional Census Director Ralph Lee, Secretary of State Sam Reed and other elected leaders to help launch the 2010 U.S. Census. Information gathered by the census helps determine how more than \$400 billion of federal funding each year is spent on projects and services.

Questions You will be Asked:

This year's census form contains just 10 questions, the least amount of questions since the 1790 census. Questions ask for name, gender, address, age, birth date, race, ethnicity and if the home the person is living in is owned or rented. All answers are kept confidential.

Birds Spotted in Gamblewood...

The Black Capped Chickadee is a common resident in Gamblewood. The breeding habitat of the Black-capped Chickadee is mixed or deciduous woods in Canada, Alaska and the northern United States. Chickadees may be found in any habitat that has trees or woody shrubs, from forests and woodlots to residential neighborhoods and parks, and sometimes weedy fields and cattail marshes. They frequently nest in birch or alder trees. They readily come to home feeders.
