The Gamblewood Community Club's Facebook group now has 279 members, which is important for a couple of reasons:

GCC Finance News

Over the last year and a half our financial situation has improved, due to the collection of a number of outstanding balances and an increase in the number of members who are paying their dues in a timely manner. We are also proceeding with a lien process on some of our members who owe the HOA the most money. The upshot is that we've gone from worrying we were going to have to raise dues to feeling like we can manage our responsibilities without an increase in our near future. Park News

If you haven't been down to our waterfront park in a while you should visit, I can't remember when it has looked so good. This last spring board member Justin Foss led a group of volunteers on a major effort to re-grade, then re-seed much of the park. The result is now apparent in grounds that are easier to play on, easier to maintain, and just generally more attractive. Big thanks to Justin and those that contributed their time and energy to this undertaking.

A "KnoxBox" was added to the park gate, giving NKFR emergency access to the park at all times, and video surveillance cameras were added at the shelters to deter vandalism.

This year we also had to switch to a new grounds-keeping service and we very pleased with the job that they are doing. New play area chips will be added again over the winter to both parks.

Movies in the Park

We've now shown 3 movies in the park, it is a lot of fun and good way to get families together socially for an evening. Most recently we showed Zootopia in August. We'd love to see more people turn out for these events (you might be surprised how good they look!), better attendance would make it more likely that we put in the effort to keep them up.
